



FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK



Dear Friends,

I would like to update you that the Environment Committee, CREDAI National has been very active in bringing to the Union Government's notice many issues that have created hurdles for real estate developers. West Bengal's concern has been to impress upon Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF & CC) for issue of necessary guidelines for time-bound issue of environmental clearance and faster resolution of environmental violation cases by the respective State Environmental Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) and State Environmental Appraisal Committee (SEAC) which the committee has taken up. Also, to bring to your notice, the Govt. of

India had published the Draft EIA Notification on 20th March 2020, inviting objections from the public. The last date for inviting suggestions and objections was 31st May 2020. Due to the pandemic, this was shifted to 30th June 2020. Later due to pressure from the public and environmentalists, the last date was shifted to 31st August 2020. Later due to a Court Order the last date was 7th September 2020. Following are the views of the Committee:

- The CREDAI Environment Committee had detailed deliberations on this subject, and in their view, the draft is well balanced except for a few points like CER and certain timelines.
- CREDAI National submitted its suggestions to the Draft EIA Notifications on 26th June 2020. The CREDAI Environment Committee submission was exhaustive and has covered all the points.
- CREDAI MCHI also submitted their detailed submission on 29th June 2020, taking into consideration the CRZ Regulations.
- There has been wide coverage on this issue in the press and Media.

Currently, we are awaiting the final notification to be released by the Government of India.

It's been an unprecedented 5 months of the 'new normal', with Covid-19 changing lives forever. Market sentiments have been down but we've tried to keep buyers' attention focused on real estate. These last 3 months, we have successfully navigated dampened spirits with the campaign mascot #GK-Da cheerfully egging on people to invest in real estate. The videos centred around #GKDa and #EtaiBestTime have generated heightened interest and have caused buyer recollection on the social media space. This campaign is coming to an end this month, but there are possibilities of reprising #GKda as and when required for the benefit of West Bengal's real estate market. I thank the campaign committee for putting in great effort into this three-month long project.

Recently, we have come across many studies which have suggested that the demand for housing is likely to go up in the near future, factoring in aspects of the 'new normal' like work-from-home, security in the form of a fixed asset etc. and thus we might also see some much needed traction in the quest for middle income homes. Also, a huge percentage of youths who had migrated from West Bengal are considering moving back or have already come back. This should serve as an opportunity to create inventory well-suited to their needs, budget etc. Many other socio-economic factors triggered by the crisis have also incidentally created a pool of serious buyers, people who were earlier happier to stay on rent are preferring to own one's home and those who were delaying their decisions to buy a house have advanced their decisions. Since Kolkata's market was not heavily speculation-drive, hence we have to keep intact that goodwill of Kolkata's real estate scene and serve the market of buyers created due to the pandemic.

I'm happy that 'Project Kalpavriksha' which we had initiated in the month of June is progressing well. Members have been donating generously for such a noble cause and I thank each one of you. Because of your contribution, we have already been able to plant 10,000 trees across Kolkata, with ground support from Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC). During the inauguration of this project at KMC, we had promised to plant 20,000 trees in the aftermath of the disastrous cyclone Amphan and it has been a deeply rewarding journey so far, giving back to the city.

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INITIATIVES TAKEN UP WITH THE STATE GOVERNMENT

Inspector General of Registration (IGR) -

CREDAI Bengal recently had a meeting with the IGR wherein the long pending issue of irrational circle rates was taken up. We were given to understand that the matter is under consideration. As regards, E- Registration of properties, acceptance of E-signatures and Biometric fingerprints to complete the process of E- Registration were sought for. It was given to understand that for the acceptance of E-signatures and Biometric fingerprints, there are some legal obligations which the Department is working on.

A letter has further been submitted with the office of the Finance Secretary, Government of West Bengal seeking the following:

- 1. A clear-cut guideline to the Registration Department for registering the Agreement to Lease.
- 2. Creation of window for registration of agreement of sub lease
- 3. Allowance of 2% stamp duty for the market value of the flats/units for registration of agreement of sub lease for under-construction projects upon leasehold lands
- 4. Adjustment of stamp duty paid for registration of agreement of sub lease against the stamp duty payable for deed of sub lease.

Fire Department -

In response to our request to Director General, Fire for allowing the presence of an authorized project architect in the Technical Evaluation Committee meetings, the Fire Department has informed us that they are actively considering our request, in view of the prevailing COVID scenario. Their decision in this regard will be communicated shortly.

However, as a special case they have agreed to allow an authorized project architect to attend TEC Meetings virtually through 'Google Meet' for which necessary meeting code will be provided on the day of the meeting.

- It helped us reach 9.4+ Lakh people with 1+ Million impressions







West Bengal to handover freehold land deeds to people of

The West Bengal government is planning to handover freehold land title deeds to over 20,000 people residing in 119 refugee colonies of the state, a senior official said on Tuesday.

In March this year Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee had distributed freehold land title deeds to the residents of 94 refugee colonies in the state.

The entire survey was conducted by officials of the state Land and Land Reforms and Refugee Relief and Rehabilitation department amid the Covid-19 pandemic situation.

She had announced about taking similar measures to distribute freehold land deeds to residents of another 119 refugee colonies.

Of the residents of the 119 refugee colonies around 3,500 beneficiaries are from neighbouring Howrah, Hooghly, North and South 24 Parganas and Nadia districts, he said.

East-West Kolkata metro renews flat contracts for Bowbazar evacuees

At present, 332 of the Bowbazar residents are staying in 82 rented flats, most in east Kolkata. Among them is Jayanta Seal, whose house on 13A, Durga Pithuri Lane, was reduced to debris.

On August 31 last year, around 700 people had to be shifted out of their homes after the tunnel boring machine hit an aquifer, leading to large-scale subsidence and build-ings crumbling.

At present, 332 of the Bowbazar residents are staying in 82 rented flats, most in east Kolkata. Among them is Jayanta Seal, whose house on 13A, Durga Pithuri Lane, was reduced to debris. "I don't even want to be reminded of that afternoon. Our old home, with all its antique furniture, is gone. It is impossible to come to terms with the loss," Seal said. The family now lives in a 2BHK flat in Phoolbagan. The rent is being paid by ITD ITD-Cementation, the company contracted to build the last leg of the underground tunnels between

Soumen Sengupta, assistant general manager, ITD ITD Cementation, said, "The rental leases for 11 months are ending one by one and we are renewing them for another 11 months. The dates of renewal are different since the families were shifted out of hotels between

mid-September and end-December last year." Ground Zero of the disaster, Durga Pithuri Lane, is now an open space. The 27 buildings there had either collapsed or were razed for safety. Now, a shaft for retrieving the two tunnel borers is being built there.

Chandi, the TBM that was digging the west-bound tunnel, has been lying defunct around 12m below the ground after the accident. Both Chandi and its twin, Urvi, digging the east-bound tunnel to Sealdah, will be pulled out of the 22m-deep, 40m-long and 15m-wide retrieval shaft and Urvi will turn around to build the rest of the west-bound tunnel till Durga Pithuri Lane.

repairs, 372 people had been taken back to 26 houses in Bowbazar.

"We are in touch with the families and will start visiting them once the pandemic ends," Sengupta said.

All this should take six months or more and flats will be built for the 332 people currently housed in rented accommodations. After
